


Member Bill Halsell is helping a friend sell these cars. He states that the Studebaker is in very good shape, runs and he has driven it.


Thank you Diane for a great program, and for the 1/12 Mustang that is now in my collection! DWR

Bill Brundydge won a bucket of car care products in the 50/50 2.0. They were generously donated by Carquest of Tallahassee.




