Coca-Cola machine for sale




The Coke machine shown here is for sale by John Schanbacher.

The History of "Ker-chunk"

The 8 track tape player system.

The first music tape system available for the car was the 8 track. It was wildly popular with customers from the mid "60s to the early "80s.. It was finally killed off by the cassette tapes. But who can forget the "ker-chunk" sound as it was changing tracks?

The 8 track system was developed in 1964 by a consortium led by Bill Lear, of Lear Jet Corporation. Along with Ampex, Ford, GM, Motorola, and RCA.

The 8 track format is now obsolete although there are still some bands that release these tapes as a novelty. Cheap Trick's "The Latest" in 2009, and Dolly Parton's Christmas in 2020.

The popularity of the 8 track cartridges grew from the booming automotive industry. Ford Motor Co. became the first to install a factory unit in the 1965 Mustang as an option. They became available on the Thunderbird, and the high end Lincolns.

RCA Victor introduced 175 titles in stereo 8 tapes from it's music catalog. By 1967, the tape players were available in all of Ford's cars.

In 1966, the popular system became available in home decks. That meant the owners could listen to a tape in the car, and finish it in the home. There were also portable "boom box" type stereos made.

Also, by the late 60s, prerecorded tapes began coming out within a month of the vinyl albums release. The 8 track format became the most popular, and offered the largest music library of any other system. Bootleg tapes were everywhere

1978 was the peak year for 8 track sales in the United States, with sales decreasing quite rapidly. Eight track players became less common in cars and homes due to the rising popularity of the cassette.

In the U.S., 8 track cartridges were phased out of retail stores by 1982.

These days, you can only see them in 60' and 70;s classic cars at shows. But they are still available on Ebay along with many cartridges. _DWR



A big Thank You goes out to Ken and Jenny Hart for a great presentation of their visit to the Lane Motor Museum in Nashville Tn.


