
The Havana Car show continues to grow from all accounts. They close off an entire side street for the cars to park.

Article about the Car show in New York



-Just a little summary on the June AACA meet in Saratoga.

Joanne and I brought our then 25-year-old S10 pickup to Saratoga Springs, a wonderful AACA meet, just 2.5 hours from home. Covid was very quiet there and then, and the drive through Upstate NY in the summer is always nice, driving by farms and even one that sold ice cream. Almost every year, we try to take a car to an AACA meet. Hershey is only 4 hours south on I-81, and some regional meets are much closer. This time, we drove a small truck northeast.

There were about 250 vehicles at the show, laid out on the grounds of the Saratoga Spa State Park, which has a spring fed spa used by many, including then: Governor Fraklin Delano Roosevelt. Before show day we rented bicycles, provided by the transit authority, riding from the State Park to Downtown Saratoga, where we stayed. It was just down the road from the famous race track.

Everyone was nice, although the show staff was tired, especially the Show Chair. We only had two Judges per car, and have noticed the number of Judges at various AACA meets dwindling. Upon attending judging schools in Hershey, I've learned that the AACA dropped incentives for many Judges. Our Saratoga Judges received no special discounts and had to pay for their breakfast at the mandatory Judges meeting before the show. Many drove quite a distance.

However, Saratoga did a great job on the show. A free ice cream social, donated by Stewarts Ice Cream, free tours of a car museum in the State Park. A BBQ cook-out, etc. It was similar to what's planned for Melbourne, but we had no air boat rides. NY doesn't do air boats. We're looking forward to that in Melbourne.

Our Oneida Lake Region President attended. He was very interested because we were recruited to hold an AACA meet in Central NY, and we were considering it. He spent a lot of time with the Saratoga Region President and Show Chairman. They were very helpful, and they told us the truth. As a result, we cancelled all plans to hold a meet in Central NY.However, the folks at Saratoga were wonderful, the venue was perfect, and there were little things nearby that you only noticed if you walked around the park. Like: a 1980 era electric car was parked at the Performing Arts Center, near to the show field. It looked like this:



Someday, I 'll tell you about the new electric car we leased for Joanne in June. It gets about 300 miles per charge, is very quick, and isn't sold in Florida or the south. It doesn't look like this.
