Bus would be \$45 per person or if we have a great turnout, \$55.00 for

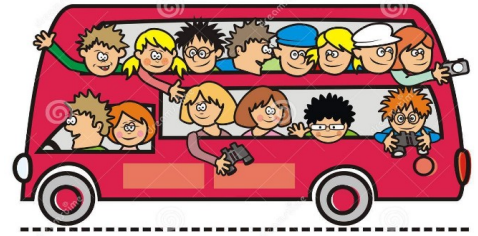
the 55 passenger bus.

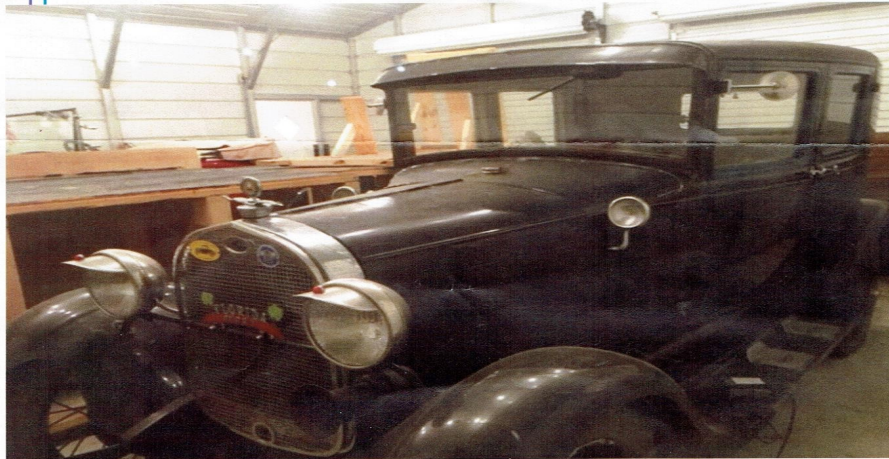

Upon our arrival home, we were both beat and in need of rest. To Jack: Thank you for the great trip my friend. I look forward to next year!!!

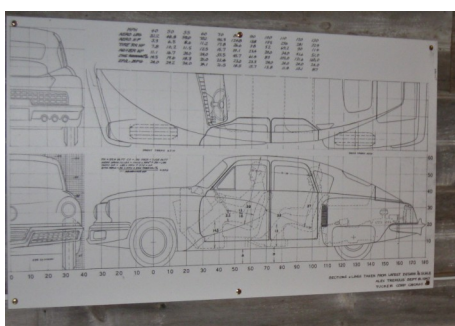


Preston Tucker Exhibit, Hershey



The AACA has obtained from the Tucker family the rights to exhibit Tuckers and memorabilia. It is housed in the museum in a very nice display. Inside are 4 Tuckers, one is a 1 of 1 automatic transmission, all the accessories that were available for the cars, and a reconstruction of Preston Tucker's office. There are the original blueprints and a concept car he designed.

In the display is a full size actual chassis for a Tucker and a large picture of the Tucker Tiger. This was a WW2 vehicle that was not accepted because it was too fast! Overall, a very enjoyable showing.
