





Lively Tech Car Show March 2nd



Becky and I bought this in 1981. We are the second owners. We were able to verify the car had only 24,500 miles on it when we bought it at 12 years old.

The car was on jack stands in our garage for 18 years. In 2022, we got it running properly again with the following work done: New fuel tank and fuel system, new brakes, rebuilt power brake booster, rebuilt carburetor, updated aluminum radiator, new belts, hoses, new carpeting, and it has electronic ignition with new wires and plugs.

I am interested in exploring the purchase of a different classic car and do not have room for extra autos. These photos were shot on January 1, 2024 after the car was cleaned up. It does need paint and upholstery, but the upholstery is original to the car. It had one repaint in the late 1980s. The AC needs refrigerant, but it works. There is minor rust behind the

rear wheels, but it is basically a solid 55-year-old automobile. We drove it in the 1980s as our second car (thus, the extra 40,000 miles). I'd like to start at \$8750 for an asking price, but will negotiate any reasonable offer to keep it in the club.

TRAACA 2024-2025 Leadership Transition Plan

The TRAACA Executive Board has been discussing a Leadership Transition Plan since its Nov.30, 2023, meeting. At the Board's February 23, 2024, meeting, following a full discussion and exchange of ideas for the most appropriate strategy, the following Plan was approved by the Board to be presented to the Club 's membership at the March 12, 2024, meeting.

<u>Who</u>: The current President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer (the operating officers have all served 2 years or more and each has notified the Exec. Board that they will not be serving another term in 2025. Please see the Executive Board leadership history at the end of this plan.

Why: The Exec. Board_members believe that it is in the best interest of the Club and the ongoing life of the Club for the current operating Officers to make every effort to prepare the next group of leaders to serve. As the Club's history shows, most of these current Officers are long time members and they have been very active and have served in leadership roles for many years. Clearly, these long time members are the best ones to train the next group of operating Officers, so they will be well prepared to step into these leadership positions.

<u>What</u>: To help address the unusual circumstances of four primary Club officers' planning to leave their positions in December 2024, The Exec. Board has developed a Leadership Transition Plan (the Plan). The basis of the Plan is to identify interested Club members who may not have previously served in leadership roles, and to prepare them to serve by training or allowing them to shadow these operating Officer positions over the remaining months of 2024, so they will be knowledgeable of the duties and responsibilities to help them to be immediately effective upon taking office.

<u>Note-</u> This Plan in no way requires a current Officer/ Director to step aside, but hopefully provides time for mentoring and training for continuity by having well-prepared successors in these positions.

How: Implementation of the 2024 Leadership Transition Plan

- 1) The Exec. Board will act as the 2024 Nominating Committee.
- 2) At the March 12, 2024, meeting, President Lester explained the 2024-2025 Leadership Transition Plan and ask members to seriously consider if they are interested in serving in any of these operating officer positions and to let him or the specific Officer know, preferably by email.
- 3) The Nominating Committee will give consideration to each Club member who volunteers. This may include an interview with the Committee and a discussion of the job description.

- 4) The Nominating Committee will select the Club member to train or shadow in each Officer position for the balance of 2024.
- 5) At the November 12, 2024, Club meeting, the Nominating Committee will present a 2025 slate of Officers and Directors to the members.
- 6) Nominations of any other members may be made and seconded by email to Pres. John Lester by October 29, 2024, so that ballots can be prepared. Any nominees must give prior consent to have their name submitted for nomination.
- 7) At the November 12, 2024, meeting, Club members will elect each of the Officers and Director positions from the list of candidates presented on the slate and by member nomination (#6 above).
- 8) Those elected Officers and Directors will be installed at the Club's regular meeting on December 10, 2024.
