

All that is required is to look the car over, grade from 1-5 in the category, and turn in the sheet. There are four categories to be graded. It will not be a hard job.


If we get the expected turnout, we need quite a few judges. Your help would be greatly appreciated. Please contact Don Romaine at 850-242-2242
